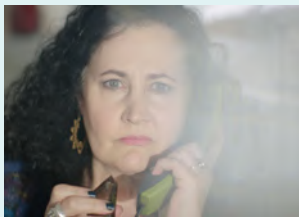

Aotearoa Short Film Lab is New Zealand's most prestigious hothouse mentoring scheme for screenwriters and aspiring screenwriters to workshop new ideas for short film.

The Lab is jointly run by Show Me Shorts and Script to Screen. It offers six local and two international short film makers the opportunity to develop their short film concepts and scripts with the guidance of experienced industry mentors.
